

Detroit Sportsman's Congress
Vintage Skeet
Rules and Regulations

National Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA) rules shall apply except for the following:

- 1) Delayed release device will be used when available, otherwise qualified puller shall provide a variable 0 to 3 second delay on the 'call'
- 2) Only Pump Action and Side by Side double barrel shotguns will be allowed.
- 3) Adjustable Stocks are not allowed
- 4) Removable insert sub-gauge tubes will not be allowed.
- 5) Handicaps for shotgun gauges are as follows:
 - 12 gauge = 0 birds / 50 birds
 - 16 gauge = 2 birds / 50 birds
 - 20 gauge = 4 birds / 50 birds
 - 28 gauge = 6 birds / 50 birds
 - 410 bore = 8 birds / 50 birds
- 6) Maximum score per round with handicap will be 24, only natural straights will score as 25.
- 7) Starting Position of gun shall require that the heel of the butt-stock shall be below the armpit of the shooter.
 - 7A) Gun must remain below the armpit until bird is released
on first error, shooter shall be warned
 - 7B) Second and further errors are lost birds
 - 7C) Recommended that shoot management will apply a 12 inch length of tape directly below the armpit of all shooters, to ease the burden on the puller/referee.
- 8) Two divisions will be shot and shall only compete against each other.
 - Division #1 – Side-by-side
 - Division #2 – Pump Action
- 9) Rounds shall consist of 50 birds with a maximum time allowed of 1 hour for a squad of 5 shooters.
- 10) Disputed items should be presented to the attention of shoot management for a final decision. All decisions by management are final.
